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The Battles for EA Bridge Knockouts Begin!

After 10 thrilling rounds of the Swiss League, the stage is set for the much-awaited Knockouts! The qualifying phase had it all — dramatic swings, remarkable comebacks, and nail-biting finishes that made following the final standings an absolute delight.

Gold Event

Team Monica Jajoo maintained their dominance throughout, securing the top spot with an impressive 140.48 VPs. Close on their heels, Team Lake my Love stormed back into contention, collecting a phenomenal 53.05 VPs in the last three rounds. The hosts, Team EA Bridge, who appeared out of the race by lunchtime, showed immense grit to bounce back and clinch the final qualifying spot in style.

Silver Event

History was made as Team Nagpur VI set a national record, amassing a jawdropping 172.43 VPs — averaging an astonishing 17.24 per round! With a 50 VP cushion over the runners-up, their run goes down as one of the highest-ever scores in an international event under the BFI banner.
